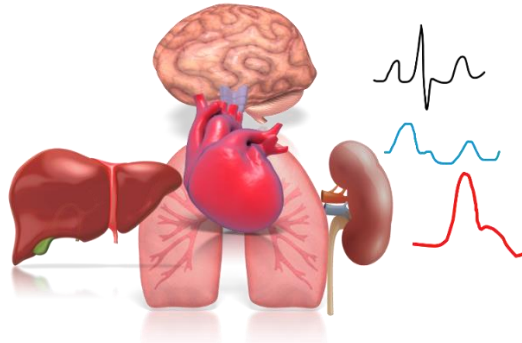


CRITICAL CARE NURSING REVIEW

ABOUT THE COURSE

This course provides an overview of the core critical care theory and competencies that are the basis for the certification examination in adult critical care nursing in Canada (CNCC-C). This course is of benefit to nurses working in critical care who are seeking a core review, or preparing to become certified (or recertified) in critical care nursing. This course is a review; content is geared to individuals with prior or current critical care experience. The course content builds upon the in-classroom review that has been offered by the instructor for many years; the curriculum has been expanded and adapted to facilitate remote learning.

HOW THE COURSE IS PROVIDED

This course is available only to registered participants. Content is organized into modules and presented through password protected prerecorded videos and handout material. At the conclusion of each module, a complimentary live follow-up class will be provided by ZOOM (on scheduled dates). The purpose of the follow-up class is to reinforce module content and apply learnings to clinical scenarios. Participation in the live class is strongly recommended to get the greatest benefit from the course (but not mandatory).
